

## Meghalaya Forms Expert Panel to Review Reservation Formula; Opposition Leader Ends Hunger Strike

THE Meghalaya government has notified an expert committee to review the state's 1972 reservation policy, seen as "unfair" to the state's Khasi community. The Conrad Sangma government was under pressure from a hunger strike called by Ardent Basaiawmoit, the president of the Voice of the People's Party (VPP) in Meghalaya, which had begun to attract support of various political parties and Khasi civil society groups.

## J.P. Morgan Raises India's FY24 GDP Forecast to 5.5% Amidst Global Economic Concerns

(Reuters) -J.P.Morgan raised its forecast for India's annual growth by 50 basis points to 5.5% for fiscal 2024, but warned that a global economic slowdown and tighter financial conditions will still drag the economy.



#### GST Revenue Collection for May Up 12% YoY at Rs 1.57 Lakh Crore

The revenue from Goods and Services Tax (GST) crossed Rs 1.57 lakh crore- mark in May for the fifth time since inception of GST, Ministry of Finance said on June 1. At Rs 1.57 lakh crore, the GST collected in May is lower than April's record Rs 1.87 lakh crore. However, the government has collected monthly GST revenues more than Rs 1.4 lakh crore for 14 months in a row now. Compared to May 2022, the latest GST collections figure is up 12 percent.

#### UPI Transactions Reach Record High of Rs 14.3 Trillion in May 2023

Unified Payment Interface (UPI) transactions in May scaled a new high of Rs 14.3 trillion in terms of value and 9.41 billion in volume. It is a 2 per cent rise in value (Rs 14.07 trillion) and 6 per cent in volume (8.89 billion) compared to April. Transactions worth around Rs 3.96 trillion happened in the last ten days of May, according to data from the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). Compared to May in Financial Year 2022-23, transaction volume increased by 58 per cent and value by 37 per cent.

# Microsoft joins Indian govt to train 6K students, 200 educators in cybersecurity skills

New Delhi, Microsoft on Thursday signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Directorate General of Training (DGT) under the Ministry of Skills Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE) to train 6,000 students and 200 educators in digital and cyber-security skills in the country. As part of this collaboration with, Microsoft will offer a wide range of courses, including training in AI, cloud computing, web development and cybersecurity skills for students.

#### India Defeat Pakistan To Become Hockey Junior Asia Cup Champions

The Indian Junior Men's Hockey Team reigned supreme as it beat nemesis Pakistan 2-1 in a thrilling Final match of the Men's Junior Asia Cup 2023 here in Salalah, Oman. Early goals by Angad Bir Singh (13') and Araijeet Singh Hundal (20') ensured India remained in command of the game while some outstanding saves by goalkeeper Shashikumar Mohith Honnenahalli kept India in the lead throughout the match.



Coromandel Express Derails and Collides with Two Other Trains in Odisha

A little after 6. 50pm on Friday, Shalimar-Chennai Coromandel Express (12841) should have passed the stationary goods train in the loop line to its left. But it didn't. A route relay interlocking system error that controls the changing of tracks meant that Coromandel did not switch to the second track at the interchange but hurtled on and rammed into the freight train at express speed.

#### RBI Launches '100 Days 100 Pays' Campaign to Settle Unclaimed Deposits

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on June 1 launched a '100 Days 100 Pays' campaign to trace and settle the top 100 unclaimed deposits of every bank in every district within 100 days. As of February end, the total amount of so-called unclaimed deposits, which are accounts that have not been operated for 10 years or more, transferred to the RBI by state-run banks was Rs 35,012 crore, the central bank said earlier.

### Dubai Emerges as India's Top Choice for Foreign Direct Investment (FDI)

Dubai, a favourite destination among tourists and shopping aficionados, is becoming the top choice among Indian investors. Dubai ranks No. 1 as the Destination City for foreign direct investment (FDI) from India in calendar year 2022. According to the Dubai FDI Monitor, India ranked among the Top 5 source countries for announced FDI projects and estimated FDI capital in calendar year 2022. India accounted for 12 percent of announced FDI projects in Dubai in 2022. Only the US (20 percent) and UK (13 percent) are ahead of India.

# Shalini Singh becomes the first female NCC cadet to complete mountaineering course

Shalini Singh created history by becoming the first female NCC cadet in India to complete the mountaineering course in the Himalayan region in Uttarakhand. After completing the mandatory basic mountaineering course, Shalini was enrolled in the 67 UP battalion.



#### Sunil Kumar wins decathlon gold at Asian U20 Athletics Championship

India's Sunil Kumar scored 7003 points and clinched gold in men's decathlon at the Asian U20 Athletics Championships in Yecheon, South Korea on Tuesday. Apart from Sunil's heroics, Pooja clinched women's high jump silver after finishing with a 1.82m jump while Bushra Khan, secured silver in women's 3000m race.

## World Bank cuts 2023 global growth forecast to 2.1% in 2023 after growing 3.1% in 2022

The World Bank (WB) said in a report on June 6 that the global economy is in a precarious situation and heading for a substantial growth slowdown as sharp interest-rate increases has hit activity and stirred the vulnerabilities in lower-income countries. That's the latest outlook of the World Bank, a 189-country anti-poverty agency, which estimates that the international economy will expand just 2.1 per cent in 2023 after growing 3.1 per cent in 2022.

## RBI permits banking units at IFSC to settle Non-deliverable foreign exchange derivative contracts (NDDCs) in rupee

The Reserve Bank of India said it has permitted banks operating International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) to offer non-deliverable derivatives contracts utilising rupees to resident non-retail users for hedging. The step has been taken in order to develop the onshore rupee non-deliverable derivatives contract market and to provide residents with the flexibility to efficiently plan their hedging activities, the RBI announced on its website on Tuesday.

### Foundation stone of ONGC National Disaster Mitigation Centre was launched in Jammu

State-owned Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) on Tuesday said it is funding the construction of a National Disaster Mitigation Centre and Yatri Niwas in Sidhra in Jammu to ease logistic challenges for tourists and pilgrims. "This ONGC-funded Yatri Niwas will solve this logistical challenge to a large extent, by providing accommodation for 30,000 tourists in a year, thus staggering the movement of tourists and pilgrims," the firm said in a statement.



RBI issues updated list of entities not authorized to deal in forex transactions

The Reserve Bank (RBI) Wednesday said it has added eight more entities or platforms or websites to the alert list of unauthorised forex trading platforms. The new additions to the alert list of unauthorised forex trading platforms include QFX Markets, 2Win Trade, Guru Trade7 Ltd, Bric Trade, Rubik Trade, Dream Trade, Mini Trade and Trust Trade, the RBI said in a statement.

### Google Pay introduces UPI verification through Aadhaar

Google Pay has introduced UPI verification via Aadhaar card. The new feature will allow customers to register for Unified Paytments Interface (UPI) without the need of debit card, according to The Hindu. The move is supported by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). Customers who want to activate UPI through Aadhaar should have a valid phone number linked to their bank and registered with the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI).

## Cyclone 'Biparjoy' in Arabian Sea rapidly intensifies into very severe cyclonic storm

In its latest weather bulletin, the India Meterological Department (IMD) on Friday said that Cyclone Biparjoy is likely to intensify more in the next 36 hours. It will move northwestwards during the next two days, IMD added. Cyclone 'Biparjoy' on June 7 rapidly intensified into a severe cyclonic storm, with meteorologists predicting a "mild" monsoon onset over Kerala and "weak" progress beyond the southern peninsula under its influence.

#### Government approves over Rs 89 thousand crore revival package for BSNL

The Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved the Rs 89,000 crore revival package for Bharat Sanchar Nigam Limited (BSNL), according to a release by the government. The package will be utilised for enhancing BSNL's 4G and 5G services. It includes allotment of 4G and 5G spectrum for the BSNL through equity infusion. The release said that the authorised capital of BSNL will be increased from Rs 1 lakh 50 thousand crore to Rs 2 lakh 10 thousand crore.

## J&K maintains first rank in UT category in Food Safety Index 2022-23; for third time in row

In a significant achievement, Jammu and Kashmir (J&K) has maintained its first rank under the union territory (UT) category in Food Safety Index 2022-23. The Department of Food and Drugs Administration, J&K, received the award third time in a row for 2021, 2022 and 2023, an official statement said on Thursday. The index is released annually by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) to measure the performance of states and UTs on various parameters of food safety.

## ISRO chairman S Somnath informs Chandrayaan 3 mission is planned to be launched by mid-July

The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) will begin a fresh bid to land a rover on the moon in the middle of July this year through the launch of the Chandrayaan-3 mission, ISRO chairman S Somanath said on Thursday on the sidelines of an international conference on Spacecraft Mission Operations (SMOPS-2023). The Chandrayaan-3 mission is identical to the Chandrayaan-2 mission.

RBI Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) decided unanimously to keep the policy repo rate unchanged at 6.5% for the second time

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Thursday left the main policy instrument, repo rate, unchanged at 6.50 per cent for the second consecutive monetary policy, giving relief to home, vehicle and other retail borrowers from an increase in equated monthly instalments (EMIs). The decision to keep the repo rate — it is the interest rate at which the RBI lends to banks in the country — unchanged was taken unanimously by the six Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) members as inflation continues to remain above the 4 per cent target.

#### RBI lets banks issue RuPay prepaid forex cards to help widen usage

In order to expand payment options for Indians travelling abroad, the Reserve Bank of India on Thursday decided to allow issuance of RuPay Prepaid Forex cards by banks in India for use at ATMs, PoS machines and online merchants overseas. Further, RuPay Debit, Credit, and Prepaid Cards will be enabled for issuance in foreign jurisdictions, which can be used internationally, including in India, Reserve Bank Governor Shaktikanta Das said, while unveiling the second bi-monthly monetary policy of this fiscal.

## Madhya Pradesh to launch 'Ladli Bahna' scheme to make women financially independent

Madhya Pradesh chief minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan on Saturday launched the electronic process to transfer ₹1,000 each in the bank accounts of 12 million women under the state's Ladli Behna scheme and said the amount will be gradually increased to ₹3,000. In an event held in Jabalpur, Chouhan started the scheme with a single click and called it a milestone towards women's empowerment.

### Indian Council of Agricultural Research signs a MOU with Amazon Kisan to Empower Farmers

New Delhi: Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) and Amazon Kisan have joined hands to guide farmers on scientific cultivation of different crops for optimum yield and income. According to the agriculture ministry statement, under the memorandum of understanding (MoU), ICAR will offer technological support to farmers through Amazon's network. This partnership is expected to enhance farmers' livelihoods and increase crop productivity.

#### Forex reserves jump \$5.9 bn to \$595 bn: Reserve Bank data

India's forex kitty jumped \$5.929 billion to \$595.067 billion for the week ended June 2, the Reserve Bank said on Friday. The reserves had dropped for two consecutive weeks and declined by \$4.34 billion to \$589.14 billion in the previous reporting week. It can be noted that in October 2021, the country's forex kitty had reached an all-time high of \$645 billion. The reserves have been declining as the central bank deploys the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressures caused majorly by global developments.

#### RBI notifies 4 key measures to strengthen 1,514 urban co-operative banks

The Ministry of Cooperation in a statement said that four important initiatives have been taken to strengthen 1,514 Urban Co-operative Banks (UCBs) in the country.

## G-20 development ministers' meet begins in Varanasi

India will host a three-day meeting of development ministers of the G20 member nations in Varanasi beginning Sunday that is expected to focus on disruptions in global supply chains, food and energy security challenges and impacts of climate change among other issues. Prime Minister Narendra Modi will deliver a special video address at the beginning of the meeting which will be chaired by External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar.

## Rohit Sharma has become the third Indian opener to cross 13,000 runs across formats

India captain Rohit Sharma completed 13,000 runs as an international opener during the World Test Championship Final against Australia at the Oval in London on Thursday. The 36-year-old is the third-quickest to the mark among all openers, only behind Matthew Hayden (293 innings) and Sachin Tendulkar (295), crossing the mark in his 307th innings. Rohit achieved the feat during the second innings of the final after being dismissed on 15 in the first innings.

# Ravindra Jadeja surpassed Bishan Singh Bedi to become the country's most successful left-arm spinner in Tests

Indian all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja on Friday created history, as he surpassed compatriot Bishan Singh Bedi to become the country's most successful left-arm spinner in the history of Test cricket. Jadeja accomplished this during India's ICC World Test Championship final against Australia at The Oval. In Australia's second innings, Jadeja put to an end innings of two centurions from the first innings, Steve Smith (34) and Travis Head (18). Jadeja ended the day with figures of 2/25 in nine overs.

#### Centre bans over 150 'anti-India' sites, YouTube news channels in 2 years

Officials familiar with the matter have revealed that the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (I&B) has taken down more than 150 websites and YouTube-based news channels since May 2021. These actions were taken due to the production of content deemed "anti-India" and in violation of Section 69A of the Information Technology (IT) Act. A senior official from the I&B ministry stated that these websites and channels were removed for producing content that was deemed to be against India's interests, as reported by HT.

## Moody's Projects 6-6.3% GDP Growth for India in June Quarter, Flags Fiscal Risks

Moody's on Sunday said the Indian economy is expected to clock a 6-6.3 per cent growth in June quarter, and flagged risks of fiscal slippage arising from weaker-than-expected government revenues in FY24. Moody's growth estimate is lower than the 8 per cent projection for the first quarter made by the Reserve Bank of India last week. In an interview with PTI.

## **₹1.2** Trillion Released as Third Tax Devolution to States by Govt

The government on Monday released the third installment of tax devolution to state governments, amounting to Rs 1.18 trillion. This is significantly higher than the normal monthly devolution of Rs 59,140 crore. The government is releasing an additional advance installment to the states in June, 2023. This is being done to help the states speed up capital spending, finance their development and welfare-related expenditures, and make resources available for priority projects and schemes, the Ministry of Finance said.

### India tops digital payments rankings globally, shows MyGovIndia data

India with 89.5 million digital transactions in the year 2022 has topped the list of five countries in digital payments, according to data from MyGovIndia. As per the data, India in the year 2022 accounting for 46 per cent of the global real-time payments, adding that the digital payment transactions in India is more than the other four leading countries combined. "India keeps dominating the digital payment landscape! With innovative solutions and widespread adoption, we're leading the way towards a cashless economy.

#### RBI not to regulate social media influencers

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), in a recent announcement, has stated that it does not have any immediate plans to introduce distinct regulations governing the activities of social media influencers in the financial markets. The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI), according to Governor Shaktikanta Das, already has measures in place to address this issue. "The RBI is not planning to issue any separate guidelines to regulate financial market.

#### PLI Schemes: Boosting Production, Employment, and Economic Growth

The production-linked incentive (PLI) schemes have led to an increase in production, employment generation, and exports of the country, a top government official said on Tuesday. Secretary in the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) Rajesh Kumar Singh said that due to the schemes, there was an increase of 76 per cent in foreign direct investment in the manufacturing sector in 2021-22 (USD 21.34 billion) compared to 2020-21 (USD 12.09 billion).

#### Education loans register 17% growth in FY23

For the first time in five years, growth in education loans not only turned positive but also registered a 17 per cent surge in the last financial year ended March, 2023. According to Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) data, the outstanding portfolio under education loans grew 17 per cent at ₹96,847 crore in the year 2022-23 as against ₹82,723 crore in the previous year. This is significant because the growth in education loans was flat during 2021-22 and it was negative for the three years prior to it.

Researchers from the Indian Institute of Technology Madras (IIT-M) have come up with a lowcost IoT-based mobile air pollution monitoring framework that uses sensors positioned on transportation systems to collect spatio-temporal data on air quality and constantly track the air quality of broad geographic regions with high degree of temporal and spatial accuracy. In other words, with these inexpensive mobile monitoring devices.

The issue will be opened for subscription during the period June 19-23, 2023, with the settlement date of June 27, 2023, the finance ministry said in a statement on Friday. The issue price of the bond during the subscription period would be Rs 5,926, it said.

"The prediction is made using a model trained with historical AISMR data, Niño3.4 index data, and categorical Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD) data for the period 1901–2001,".

Islamabad: The UK on Thursday announced the appointment of senior diplomat Jane Marriott as the next British High Commissioner to Pakistan, making her the first female British envoy to Islamabad. Prior to this appointment, Jane Marriott, 47, was the high commissioner to Kenya since September 2019. She would be replacing Dr Christian Turner, who left Pakistan in January after serving as the envoy since December 2019.

#### Ramachandra Guha's book wins Elizabeth Longford Prize


