

Prime Minister Inaugurates 91 FM Radio Transmitters, To Benefit Border, Aspirational Districts

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday inaugurated 91 FM transmitters spread across 18 states and two union territories and asserted his government was working towards giving people in every nook and corner of the country affordable access to technology. Inaugurating the 91 FM transmitters in border areas and aspirational districts, Modi said the move would take FM radio services to more than two crore people staying in remote regions and give them affordable access to information.

NPCI International Payments partners with PPRO to expand reach of RuPay and UPI

NPCI International Payments, a wholly-owned subsidiary of National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), entered into partnership with digital payments infrastructure provider PPRO to facilitate global e-commerce payments through UPI. The agreement is aimed at expanding RuPay card and UPI acceptance across global clients such as payment service providers (PSPs) and global merchant acquirers, NPCI said in a release.

Banks end FY23 with a robust 15.4 pc credit growth: RBI Data

Scheduled commercial banks (SCBs) reported a robust credit growth of 15.4 per cent in FY23 against 9.7 per cent in FY22, powered by growth in personal loans, and loans to services sector and agriculture and allied activities. Personal loans registered a growth of 20.6 per cent in FY23 as compared with 12.6 per cent in the year ago period, primarily driven by 'housing loans', according to RBI data on sectoral deployment of bank credit. RBI collected data from 40 select scheduled commercial banks.

Rajneesh Karnatak Named as New MD and Chairman of Bank of India

According to the announcement, he would serve as MD & CEO of Bank of India for a term of three years beginning on the day of assumption of office or until further instructions. Meanwhile, Debadatta Chand has been named as Managing Director & Chief Executive Officer of the Bank of Baroda for a period of three years, as per a Finance Ministry notification.

BARC director A K Mohanty appointed as new Atomic Energy Commission chairman

Renowned physicist and Director of the Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC) Ajit Kumar Mohanty has been appointed as the chairman of the Atomic Energy Commission and the secretary of the Department of Atomic Energy. Mohanty succeeds K N Vyas to the posts that oversee India's nuclear programme and forays into harnessing atomic power for civilian needs. "The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved the appointment of Dr Ajit Kumar Mohanty, Director, Bhabha Atomic Research Centre.

Satwiksairaj and Chirag Shetty end India's 52-year wait for men's doubles medal in Badminton Asia Championships

India's top men's doubles pair Satwiksairaj Rankireddy and Chirag Shetty won gold after beating the Malaysian pair of Ong Yew Sin and Teo Ee Yi 16-21, 21-17, 21-19 in the final at the Badminton Asia Championships in Dubai on Sunday. There was little to separate the two pairs as the opening game started on an even note.

India's GST Revenues Hit Record High in April at ₹1.87 lakh crore

GST collection grew by 12 per cent in April to ₹1.87 lakh crore, the highest monthly mop-up since the rollout of the indirect tax regime. The gross GST revenue collected in the month of April 2023 is ₹1,87,035 crore of which CGST is ₹38,440 crore, SGST is ₹47,412 crore, IGST is ₹89,158 crore (including ₹34,972 crore collected on import of goods) and cess is ₹12,025 crore, the finance ministry said in a statement.

Justice TS Sivagnanam appointed as Chief Justice of Calcutta High Court

Kolkata: Justice T S Sivagnanam was on Monday appointed as the Chief Justice of the Calcutta High Court. The Department of Justice in the Union Law Ministry issued a notification announcing the appointment. The Supreme Court Collegium had recommended his name in February this year as the then chief justice, Justice Prakash Shrivastava, was to demit office on March 30. Justice Sivagnanam originally belongs to the Madras High Court and was so far the senior-most judge after the chief justice in the Calcutta HC.

NTPC and NPCIL sign agreement for joint development of nuclear power plants

NTPC Ltd, on Monday, signed a supplementary joint venture agreement with Nuclear Power Corporation of India Ltd (NPCIL) for the development of nuclear power projects, a power ministry statement said. This supplementary joint venture agreement marks a pivotal step for NTPC Ltd and NPCIL to collaborate and cooperate in the field of development of nuclear power projects which shall help the country in meeting its clean energy commitments to achieve a net zero emission target by 2070.

IIT Madras researchers develop machine learning tool to detect tumour in brain, spinal cord

Researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Madras have developed a Machine Learning (ML)-based computational tool for better detection of cancer-causing tumours in the brain and spinal cord. Glioblastoma is a fast and aggressively growing tumour in the brain and spinal cord.

Toll collection through FASTag system reaches all-time high at over Rs 193 crore

New Delhi: National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) on Tuesday said its daily toll collection through FASTag has reached about ₹193 crore. "On 29th April 2023, the daily toll collection through FASTag system achieved a historic milestone, reaching an all-time high collection of Rs. 193.15 crore, with 1.16 crore transactions recorded in a single day," the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways said in a statement.



Indian Government bans 14 apps in Jammu and Kashmir, cites use by terror groups

The Centre has blocked 14 mobile applications, which were, according to central intelligence agencies, being used by terrorists and their supporters in Jammu and Kashmir. The move has been taken on the recommendation of the Ministry of Home Affairs, said a source. The apps which have been blocked are Wickrme, Mediafire, Briar, BChat, Nandbox, Conion, IMO, <u>Element, Second line, Zangi, Threema, Crypviser, Enigma, and Safeswiss</u>.

Japan to train 1,000 Indian engineers for bullet train project

Training for the first batch of 16 Indian engineers — for laying of tracks for the Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train project — has begun in Surat, an official release stated Monday. "The training of Indian engineers and leaders has started for the High-Speed Rail Track system for Mumbai-Ahmedabad HSR corridor (MAHSR), for T-2 Package (covering 237 km between Vapi and Vadodara)," it stated. About 20 Japanese experts will be imparting intensive training to the Indian engineers, supervisors, and technicians and certify their skills.

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) gold reserves touched 794.64 metric tonnes in fiscal 2023

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) added 34.22 metric tonnes of gold in the fiscal year that ended March 31, 2023, taking the total gold reserves to 794.64 metric tonnes. RBI held 760.42 metric tonnes as of March 31, 2022, compared to 695.31 metric tonnes as of March 31, 2021. The gold reserves as of March 31, 2023, included gold deposits of 56.32 metric tonnes, according to the RBI's half-yearly report on Management of Foreign Exchange Reserves- October 2022 – March 2023.

Fintech sector to become \$1.5 trillion industry by 2030

Revenues in the financial technology sector are projected to grow sixfold from \$245 billion to \$1.5 trillion by 2030, said a report by Boston Consulting Group (BCG) and QED Investors. The fintech sector, which currently holds a 2 per cent share of the global financial services revenue of \$12.5 trillion, is estimated to grow up to 7 per cent.



Moody's predicts India's economy to recover with 5.5% GDP growth in 2023

Global rating agency Moody's Investor Service on Wednesday raised India's economic growth forecast to 5.5% in 2023 from 4.8% pegged earlier, due to higher capital expenditure proposed in the Budget and a sustained economic momentum. It has, however, revised downwards India's growth estimate for 2022 to 6.8% from 7% pegged in November last year. The forecast comes just a day after the second advance estimates of national income retained India's GDP growth at 7% for 2022-23.

Wastewater study detects a large, silent wave in Bengaluru

The XBB.1.16 Omicron recombinant first detected in India on December 25, 2022 has become the dominant variant in the country. Based on 2,856 genome sequences from India posted on GISAID between December 1, 2022 and April 8, 2023, a team led by Dr. Rajesh P. Karyakarte, Head of the Microbiology Department at the BJ Medical College, Pune found that the XBB.1.16 lineage had grown from 9.3% in the first week of February to 79.17% in the first week of April.

As record-high gold rates and high price volatility affected consumption, India's gold demand during the January-March quarter declined by 17 per cent to 112.5 tonnes, according to the World Gold Council (WGC). Overall gold demand during the corresponding quarter in 2022, was at 135.5 tonnes, WGC's Gold Demand Trends Q1 2023 stated. "India's gold demand in Q1 2023 fell 17 per cent year-on-year to 112.5 tonnes following record high and volatile gold prices.

India-US bilateral trade has been recorded at highest point in past few years

Commerce & Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said that India-US partnership is at a 'defining stage' and the two countries will continue to work towards diversifying and deepening trade and investment ties for mutual growth and prosperity. While speaking at the 31st Annual General Meeting, he said that the bilateral trade between India and US has been the highest in the couple of years and is aimed to increase multifold in the coming years. Goyal also added that with the increasing eminence and recognition of India across the world.

National Green Tribunal (NGT) levies ₹4,000 crore environmental compensation on Bihar for failure in waste management

The National Green Tribunal has imposed a Rs 4,000 crore environmental compensation on Bihar for failing to scientifically manage solid and liquid waste, in accordance with the polluter pays principle. A bench of chairperson Justice A K Goel directed that the amount be deposited in a ring-fenced account within two months. The account will be operated only under the chief secretary's directions for waste management in the state.

The credit line, part of about \$4 billion in emergency assistance extended by India during the peak of Sri Lanka's financial crisis early last year, was scheduled to end in March. Postnegotiations, the credit line was extended until March 2024, said Sri Lanka's Deputy Treasury Secretary Priyantha Rathnayake.

Retail Inflation Sees Significant Drop in April, Hits 4.7%

India's retail inflation in the month of April eased to an 18-month low of 4.70 per cent, data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO) on Friday showed. At 4.70, the consumer price index (CPI) in April remained below the upper threshold of the Reserve Bank of India's medium-term 4+/- 2 percent target. The country's headline inflation remained within the tolerance range of the RBI for the second consecutive month. In March, India's headline inflation stood at 5.66 per cent.

London stock exchange group to set up technology centre in Hyderbad

The London Stock Exchange Group PLC (LSEG) will set up a technology centre of excellence in Hyderabad, which will create about 1,000 jobs a year. Shooters Mairaj Ahmad Khan and Ganemat Sekhon won India its first medal in the ongoing International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) Shotgun World Cup, winning the gold medal by defeating Mexicans Luis Raul Gallardo Oliveros and Gabriela Rodriguez 6-0 in the skeet mixed team event on Sunday (April 30) in Egypt. It was a second gold medal win in mixed team event for young Indian shooter Ganemat Sekhon, also a fourth senior World Cup medal, while veteran shooter Mairaj secured his fifth senior ISSF medal after the gold medal win.

After adopting new Constitution, Uzbekistan calls presidential election

TALLINN, Estonia (AP) — Uzbekistan's leader on Monday called a snap presidential election for July, with the announcement coming a week after a constitutional referendum extended the term from five years to seven. President Shavkat Mirziyoyev is in his second term, the maximum allowed by the constitution. But the referendum passage allows him to begin the count of terms anew and run for two more, raising the possibility that the 65-year-old leader could stay in office until 2037.

President Xi Jinping will host a two-day summit with the leaders of five Central Asian nations next week, Beijing said on Monday, as China moves to increase its influence in the region. Leaders of Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan are expected to attend the China-Central Asia Summit from May 18 to 19, said China's foreign ministry. The summit in the city of Xi'an is the first of its kind, according to Chinese state media, and will focus on strengthening economic and diplomatic ties with Beijing.

Arab League readmits Syrian government after 11-year absence

The Arab League has re-admitted Syria after an 11-year absence, the organization said Sunday, following an extraordinary meeting at the Arab League's headquarters in Cairo, Egypt. The reentry comes with immediate effect, after Syria was suspended during a violent crackdown on anti-government protests. The Arab League is an organization of Middle Eastern and African countries and the Palestine Liberation Organization. Its purpose is to promote closer political, economic, cultural and social relations among the members.

Asian Weightlifting Championships: Jeremy Lalrinnunga wins silver medal at Jinju, Korea

Indian weightlifter Jeremy Lalrinnunga won a silver medal in snatch but could not get an overall total as he failed to lift the weight in any of his three clean and jerk attempts in a disappointing show at the Asian Championships here on Sunday. Competing in his first tournament since the 2022 Commonwealth Games, Jeremy was the only one in the 12-lifter field who did not finish (DNF) his event.

Messi, 35, finally landed a first World Cup winners medal in Qatar last December after a thrilling penalty shootout final win over France - enough to earn him an individual accolade while the seven-time Ballon d'Or winner also accepted the team award at a prestigious Paris ceremony.



Sherpa becomes 2nd person to scale Everest 26 times

A Nepali Sherpa guide climbed Mount Everest for the 26th time, officials said, matching the record set by a fellow Nepalese guide, Kami Rita Sherpa, for the most ascents of the world's highest peak. Pasang Dawa Sherpa, 46, stood atop the 8,849-metre (29,032-foot) peak on Sunday, becoming the world's second person to achieve the feat, Bigyan Koirala.



Ex-NBC Universal ad chief Linda Yaccarino named as new Twitter CEO
