

Government approves Restructuring of Indian Bureau of Mines

NEW DELHI: The government today approved the restructuring of Indian Bureau of Mines to reform the mineral sector regulation. The restructuring would enable the adoption of IT and space technology by the bureau to improve its effectiveness in mineral regulation and development, the mines ministry said in a statement. It said the Union Cabinet has approved "the restructuring of the Indian Bureau of Mines (IBM) by upgradation, creation and abolition of certain posts of Joint Secretary-level and above".

Pradhan Mantri Vaya Vandan Yojana: Cabinet doubles investment limit for senior citizens

NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on Wednesday approved extending the investment limit from Rs 7.5 lakh to Rs 15 lakh under the Pradhan Mantri Vaya Vandana Yojana (PMVVY). It also extended the last date for subscription to the scheme till March 31, 2020. The time limit was earlier supposed to end on May 4 this year. The PMVVY is being implemented through Life Insurance Corp (LIC) to provide social security during old age and protect the elderly aged 60 years and above against a future fall in their interest income due to uncertain market conditions. The scheme provides an assured pension based on a guaranteed rate of return of 8 per cent per annum for 10 years.

National Digital Communications Policy 2018: DoT releases draft Telecom policy

The draft of National Telecom Policy (NTP) 2018 aka National Digital Communications Policy 2018 has been uploaded for public consultations on the Department of Telecom's (DoT) website late Tuesday night. One of the key strategies in the draft talks of recognising spectrum as a key natural resource for public benefit to achieve India's socio-economic goals, optimise availability and utilisation by making adequate spectrum available to be equipped for the new broadband era. On spectrum pricing, it said there should be optimal pricing of spectrum to ensure sustainable and affordable access to digital communications and simplifying the process of obtaining permissions from various agencies.

President to preside over PM-headed panel on Gandhi 150th birth Anniversary

The first meeting of the national committee for commemoration of the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, held in Delhi on Wednesday, resolved to create a smaller executive committee chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi for better planning. Maintaining that the event should serve to increase awareness about Gandhiji globally as well, Prime Minister Modi said it is important that this occasion be celebrated in a manner that ensures Mahatma Gandhi continues to be an inspiration for future generations.

9th India-Japan Energy Dialogue held in New Delhi

New Delhi: Amid rising persuasion for countries to adapt to the concept of electric vehicles (EVs), India and Japan on Tuesday agreed to initiate discussion on the same by collaborating with "Policy dialogue on next generation/Zero emission vehicles". In the 9th India-Japan Energy Dialogue held here earlier in the day, both countries agreed to work together in promoting well-functioning energy markets, energy security, energy access and issues pertaining to climate change.

GOBAR-DHAN Scheme launched to promote wealth and energy from waste

The scheme also aims at creating new rural livelihood opportunities and enhancing income for farmers and other rural people. The Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) comprises two main components for creating clean villages – creating open defecation free (ODF) villages and managing solid and liquid waste in villages. With over 3.5 lakh villages, 374 districts and 16 States/UTsof the country being declared ODF, the stage is set for ODF-plus activities, including measures to enhance solid and liquid waste management.

Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana: Cabinet approves setting up of 20 AIIMS

New Delhi: In a major boost to expansion of health care infrastructure in the country, the Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved the continuation of the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) beyond 12th Five Year Plan to 2019-20. The PMSSY, which is a central sector scheme, aims at correcting the imbalances in the availability of affordable tertiary health care facilities in different parts of the country in general.

CBDT inks 200th Unilateral Advance Pricing Agreement

The CBDT today said it has signed its 200th unilateral advance pricing agreement (UAPA), which is aimed at promoting government's resolve of non-adversarial tax regime. The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) had entered into one UAPA during April, thus taking the total count to 200. The UAPA entered into during April 2018 pertains to provision of sourcing support services. With the signing of one agreement in April.

Meteorological Department issues warning of another dust storm in UP, Rajasthan

After some inactivity on Thursday and Friday, another set of thunderstorms is likely to hit India's northwestern plains on Saturday, the Met department said. According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), regions including northern Rajasthan, western Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and parts of Uttarakhand will be affected. Thunderstorms, along with squall, are very likely at isolated places over Assam and Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura as well, added the IMD.

EPFO launches View Pension Passbook Service on Umang App

NEW DELHI: Pensioners would now be able to view their pension passbook on mobile phones with the help of Umang app. Retirement fund body EPFO today announced the launch of a facility to extend the special service to pensioners. A labour ministry statement said 'View Pension Passbook' service for pensioners will be available through Umang app. The introduction of this facility is part of EPFO's plan to go paperless by August this year and provide all services online.

SWAYAM: Government notifies 75 National Resource Centres for Higher Education faculty

To better the quality of teaching in the country, Human Resource Development Ministry has launched an initiative to train teachers using digital platform. Using the Massive Open Online Courses platform SWAYAM, the central government intends to update the teaching technique of 1.5 million higher education faculty with focus on new and emerging trends. To achieve this, in the first phase.

GST Council constitutes 2 Group of Ministers on digital payments and Cess on Sugar

New Delhi, May 4 () The all-powerful GST Council today deferred a decision on levying a cess on sugar and referred the issue of incentivising digital payments to a group of state finance ministers. The panel, the highest decision making body of the Goods and Services Tax (GST) regime, in its 27th meeting agreed to a proposal to convert the GST Network -- the company that provides IT backbone to the new indirect tax regime -- into a government-owned entity.

Government launches National Water Informatics Centre

NEW DELHI: The government has set up a central body - National Water Informatics Centre (NWIC) - to maintain a comprehensive water resources data. It will be a single window source of updated data on water resources in India. The NWIC will also collaborate with leading national and international research institutes to provide technical support to central and state organisations dealing with water emergency response of hydrological extremes.

GST Council approves converting GSTN into government owned entity

NEW DELHI: The GST Council has approved making GST Network (GSTN) a government entity by taking over stakes held by private entities, Finance Minister Arun Jaitley said on Friday at the end of the 27th meeting of the council. Jaitley said the GST Network or GSTN currently is 24.5 per cent owned by the central government and a similar percentage is held by state governments collectively. The remaining 51 per cent is with five private financial institutions -- HDFC Ltd, HDFC Bank Ltd, ICICI Bank Ltd, NSE Strategic Investment Co and LIC Housing Finance Ltd.

NITI Aayog ink Sol with IBM to develop Precision Agriculture using Artificial Intelligence

New Delhi, May 4 (IANS) The government's policy think-tank NITI Aayog on Friday decided to partner with leading technology company IBM to develop a crop yield prediction model using artificial intelligence (AI) to provide real time advisory to farmers in "aspirational districts". "The partnership aims to work together towards use of technology to provide insights to farmers to improve crop productivity, soil yield, control agricultural inputs with the overarching goal of improving farmers' incomes," an official statement said.

India to host 15th Asia Media Summit

India will host the 15th Asia Media Summit from May 10-12 in which representatives from nearly 40 countries will delve on issues related to the media sector, the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting said today. With the theme, Telling Our Stories Asia and More', India is hosting the annual summit of the Asia-Pacific Institute for Broadcasting Development (AIBD) Kuala Lumpur for the first time.

First Apex Conference for CEOs of Smart Cities held in Bhopal

Minister of Housing & Urban Affairs Hardeep Singh Puri on Tuesday inaugurated the first of its kind conference of the CEOs of the 'Smart Cities' that aims at cross-sharing of knowledge among the cities. Apart from the Smart City CEOs, the participants include representatives from municipal, state and central government and various other stakeholders in the Smart City Mission from the civil society, academia, industry etc.

CBDT notifies Protocol amending DTAA between India and Kuwait

The Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) has notified a protocol to amend the existing double taxation avoidance pact (DTAA) between India and Kuwait. The protocol, which was signed on January 15, 2017, was notified on May 4 this year, an official release said. It had entered into force on March 26, updating the provisions in the DTAA for exchange of information as per international standards. Further, the protocol enables sharing of the information received from Kuwait for tax purposes.

NITI Aayog ink SoI with Google to help grow AI ecosystem in India

Aiming to foster growth for India's nascent artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning (ML) ecosystem, NITI Aayog and Google have come together to work on a range of initiatives to help build the AI ecosystem across the country. A Statement of Intent (SoI) was signed to this effect by Ms. Anna Roy, Advisor, NITI Aayog and Shri Rajan Anandan, Vice President, India and South East Asia, Google in the presence of the Shri Amitabh Kant, CEO, NITI Aayog.

Government to set up additional 100 One Stop Centres for women safety

As many as 100 additional districts would have One Stop Centres (OSC) aimed at supporting women affected by violence, as part of plans to cover all districts of the country in due course, an official statement said on Monday. "In the Programme Approval Board (PAB) meeting of the Ministry of Women and Child Development today, 100 additional One Stop Centres have been approved in the states of Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh.

Bhupathy's shieldtail: New species of shieldtail snake discovered in Western Ghats

Just 40 cm long and iridescent brown, Bhupathy's shieldtail is the latest addition to the snake fauna of the Western Ghats. The snake, currently observed only in the forests of the Anaikatty hills in Tamil Nadu's Coimbatore district, has been named Uropeltis bhupathyi, after the late herpetologist S. Bhupathy, for his contributions to the field. The reptile belongs to a family of snakes found only in peninsular India and Sri Lanka..

Arun-3 Hydropower Project: Nepal grants license to India's Satluj Jal Vidyut Nigam Ltd to generate power

Nepal has granted an Indian government-owned subsidiary the power generation licence from a 900-megawatt hydropower project, days ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's two-day visit to the country from May 11. Investment Board Nepal (IBN) recently granted the licence to Satluj Jala Vodyut Nigam Power Development Company, a subsidiary of Indian government-owned Satluj Jal Vidyut Nigam Ltd, to generate power from the Arun-3 Hydropower Project located in eastern Nepal.

TRAI releases draft of telecom interconnection regulation

The Indian telecom regulator on Tuesday released the draft amendment of telecommunication interconnection where it has set time-frame for provisioning of ports for initial interconnection and augmentation to be increased to a maximum 42 working days. The draft said a service provider may request the other service provider for additional ports at a Point of Interconnection (POI), if the projected utilisation of the capacity of such POI at the end of 60 days from the date of placing the request.

Asia Power Index: India ranks fourth in Asia-Pacific region

New York: India has ranked fourth out of 25 nations in the Asia-Pacific region on an index that measures their overall power, with the country being pegged as a "giant of the future" but trails behind in indicators of defence networks and economic relationships. The Lowy Institute Asia Power Index measures power across 25 countries and territories in the Asia-Pacific region, reaching as far west as Pakistan, as far north as Russia, and as far into the Pacific as Australia, New Zealand and the US.

Government approves green licence plates for private electric vehicles

To promote electric vehicles in India, the government has approved green licence plates bearing numbers in white fonts for private e-vehicles and yellow for taxis, Union Minister Nitin Gadkari said today. The government also plans to allow youth in the age bracket of 16-18 years to drive electric scooters, besides mandating taxi aggregators to have a certain percentage of e-vehicle fleet.

Government launches Digital India Internship Scheme portal

NEW DELHI, MAY 9, In an effort to enhance skills of the youngsters, Ministry of Electronics and Information technology (MeitY) on Wednesday has launched 'Digital India Internship Scheme' portal in which a token of ₹10,000 will also be offered to interns as remuneration per month. The MeitY's internship scheme will offer 25 slots in each session – summer and winter, Ravi Shankar Prasad, Minister of Electronics and IT and Law & Justice.

Stanford University to assist UP in combating chronic diseases

Uttar Pradesh Health Minister Sidharth Nath Singh on Wednesday informed that the United States Stanford University will come in a partnership with the state to combat disease like Japanese Encephalitis (JE) and Acute Encephalitis Syndrome (AES). Singh, who headed the high-powered delegation of top state officials to the United States, said this in a press briefing here. "Stanford University will come in a partnership with us to combat disease like Japanese Encephalitis (JE) & Acute Encephalitis Syndrome (AES) in Uttar Pradesh," Singh said.

IAF for first time successfully conducts online scheduled test for airmen recruitment

NEW DELHI: The Indian Air Force successfully conducted scheduled test for airmen recruitment (STAR) online last week for the first time, the IAF said in a statement on Thursday. A total of 4,09,169 candidates had registered for the online examination for airmen. The online examination was successfully conducted at 439 centres spread over 102 cities across the country from May 3-6.

Atal Tinkering Marathon: Top 30 Innovations showcased

To promote innovation among students, the NITI Aayog will set up 5,000 Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs) by March 2019 covering all districts in the country, NITI Aayog Vice-Chairman Rajiv Kumar said on Thursday. Kumar's remarks came during an event showcasing top 30 innovations by school students which emerged out of the six-month-long nationwide Atal Tinkering Marathon conducted in over 2,000 such labs set up till now. NITI Aayog had in December selected an additional 1,500 schools for setting up ATLs under the government's.

India, Nepal flag offs bus service between Janakpur and Ayodhya under Ramayan Circuit

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his Nepalese counterpart K P Sharma Oli on Friday jointly inaugurated a direct bus service between Janakpur and Ayodhya - the two sacred cities for Hindus. "Janakpur and Ayodhya are being connected. This is a historic moment," Prime Minister Modi said while inaugurating the bus service as part of the Ramayan Circuit to promote religious tourism in Nepal and India.

Government to expand Buddhist tourism circuit to 21 more states

EARLIER envisaged by the government as mainly comprising seven major Buddhist pilgrimage sites, in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar, the 'Buddhist Circuit' will now be expanded to 21 other states. The Ministry of Tourism has identified stupas and viharas in these states, around which small intra-state Buddhist zones will be developed. These include the election-bound states of Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan, as also Kerala, West Bengal, Goa, Gujarat and Jammu & Kashmir.

IMD to deploy 30 more doppler radars across India

New Delhi: The India Meteorological Department (IMD) will add 30 Doppler radars in the next two-three years across the country, of which several will be in the northeast, a senior IMD official said. Doppler radars provide precise information about thunderstorms, dust storms, hailstorms, rainfall and wind patterns. With a radius of 250km, they help in issuing nowcasts 2-3 hours prior to severe weather events. By the next year, Jammu and Kashmir will get four Doppler radars, Uttarakhand and Himachal Pradesh three each, additional director general (ADG) Devendra Pradhan said.

Government to link 200 more mandis to eNAM

The Government will link additional 200 wholesale mandis to the online trading platform eNAM this fiscal and also encourage inter-mandi transactions, Agriculture Secretary SK Pattanayak has said. At present, 585 regulated mandis in 14 States are linked with the electronic National Agriculture Market (eNAM) launched in April 2016. "There were initial hiccups but those have been overcome. The eNAM system is now more established. Farmers are very happy and more States have started showing interest," Pattanayak said.

First all-woman Post Office Passport Seva Kendra starts operations in Phagwara, Punjab

In a first, a Post Office Passport Seva Kendra (POPSK) run by an all-woman team has started operations here today. The seva kendra was inaugurated by Union Minister Vijay Sampla in the local head Post Office. It was 192nd POPSK in the country, but first one to be operated by an all-woman team. "It was part of the Centre's initiative for women empowerment," Sampla said said. According to Jalandhar regional Passport Officer Harmanbir Singh Gil.

4 states, 1 UT sign MoUs for implementation of Ayushman Bharat scheme

Four BJP-ruled north Indian states and one Union Territory signed a pact here on Monday with the National Health Mission to implement government of India's Ayushman Bharat scheme that aims to provide free treatment to the poor. However, Congress-ruled Punjab refused to sign the memorandum of understanding (MoU), saying the state had "some issues that needs to be resolved first before the scheme launch".

Government issues National Wind-Solar Hybrid Policy

MUMBAI: With an aim to boost renewable power generation, the government today announced a national wind-solar hybrid policy, which seeks to promote new projects as well as hybridisation of the existing ones. The government has set an ambitious target of achieving 175 gigawatt (gw) of installed capacity from renewable energy sources by 2022, which includes 100 gw of solar and 60 gw of wind power capacity.

Atal Pension Yojana's subscriber base crosses 1 crore mark: PFRDA

Atal Pension Yojana (APY) Scheme's subscriber base crossed 1 crore on completion of 3 years of the Scheme launch. APY was launched by the Prime Minister of India, Shri Narendra Modi at a function in Kolkataon 9thMay,2015 and the current number of subscribers stands at 1.10 Crore. Atal Pension Yojana (APY), a guaranteed Pension Scheme for citizens of India announced by the Government of India, is focused on the unorganised sector workers which constitute more than 85% of workforce. Under the APY, the guaranteed minimum pension of Rs. 1,000/-.

First International Rail Coach Expo held in Chennai, Tamil Nadu

CHENNAI, MAY 16, For the first time in India, an International Rail Coach Expo (IRCE) event on rail coaches and train sets will be held in Chennai providing a platform to bring together different suppliers under one roof and create synergies for 'Make in India.' Hosted by Integral Coach Factory in coordination with CII and RITES Ltd, the expo will be held from May 17 to 19 at ICF, the world's largest rail manufacturing unit and part of the Indian Railways.

Cabinet approves setting up of Central University in Andhra Pradesh

NEW DELHI, MAY 16, The Cabinet today approved the setting up of a central university in Janthaluru district of Andhra Pradesh. A provision of Rs 450 crore has been approved for meeting the first phase expenditure towards establishment of the university. "The Union Cabinet gives in principle nod for setting up of 'Central University in the State of Andhra Pradesh' in village Janthaluru of Anantapur district. The Cabinet also approved provision of Rs 450 crore for meeting the first phase of expenditure towards establishment of university," Union HRD Minister Prakash Javadekar said in a series of tweets.

CSTT adopts AYUSH word for scientific and technical purposes

The Commission for Scientific and Technical Terminology (CSTT) has decided to adopt the acronym "AYUSH" as a word, both in the English and Hindi languages, for scientific and technical purposes, an official release said today. The CSTT adopted the acronym as a word based on a proposal of the Ministry of AYUSH. The ministry in the release said "AYUSH" became popular as the acronym for five traditional systems of medicine -- Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy, Unani, Siddha and Homoeopathy.

WHO publishes its first Essential Diagnostics List

NEW DELHI; The World Health Organisation (WHO) has published its first 'essential diagnostics list', a catalogue of tests needed to diagnose the most common conditions as well as a number of global priority diseases. The step was taken to address the problem of people's inability to access diagnostic services, thus failing to receive the correct treatment. "An accurate diagnosis is the first step to getting effective treatment.

Parcel Cargo Express Train connecting northeast to West Coast begins operation

Railway Minister Piyush Goyal-led Indian Railways takes another big step to improve freight movement from North-East! This time the national transporter has connected North-east Region to the West Coast by running a Parcel Cargo Express Train (PCET) for transportation of agricultural produce of Northeast region such as pineapple, turmeric, ginger, cane, tea, wax as well as industrial finished goods from New Guwahati Yard (NGC) in Guwahati to Kalyan in Maharastra.

PM Narendra Modi inuagrates Kishanganga Hydroelectric project in J&K

New Delhi: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday dedicated the state run NHPC Ltd's Kishanganga hydro power project in Jammu and Kashmir to the nation. The development assumes significance given the strategic importance of the 330 megawatt (MW) project on the river Kishanganga, a tributary of Jhelum. While Pakistan had challenged the project under the Indus Waters Treaty of 1960.

Supreme Court approves draft Cauvery Management Scheme

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court today approved the Centre's draft Cauvery Management Scheme for smooth distribution of water among four southern riparian states. A bench headed by Chief Justice Dipak Misra rejected the suggestions of Karnataka and Kerala governments over the scheme, terming them as devoid of merits. The bench, also comprising Justices A M Khanwilkar and D Y Chandrachud, said the Cauvery Water Disputes Tribunal's award, which was modified by the apex court,

IIT Kanpur sets up India's first advisory centre for energy

The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT-K) has set up first of its kind Centre for Energy Regulation (CER) in the country to strengthen policy and regulatory limitations in energy and power sector. PK Pujari, chairperson, CERC unveiled the centre's logo and its web portal at the launch ceremony held in New Delhi on May 17. Anoop Singh, an associate professor in the department of industrial and management engineering at IIT-K and the coordinator of CER, said.

Zojila tunnel: PM Narendra Modi launches construction of Asia's longest road tunnel

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday inaugurated the Zojila tunnel project, which will provide all-weather connectivity between Srinagar, Kargil and Leh and, at 14.2 km, will also be the country's longest road tunnel. The tunnel will cut down the time taken to cross the Zojila pass from the 3.5 hours to 15 minutes. It will also be Asia's longest bi-directional tunnel and will be built at a cost of ₹6,809 crore. It is expected to be completed in five years.

UJALA scheme: EESL distributes over 30 crore LED bulbs across the country

NEW DELHI: State run Energy Efficiency Services Ltd (EESL) today said it has distributed over 30 crore light emitting diode (LED) bulbs across the country under the Unnat Jyoti by Affordable LEDs for All (UJALA) scheme. The UJALA scheme was launched by Prime Minister of India Narendra Modi in January 2015 and is currently the largest LED distribution programme in the world.

e-Visa Scheme: Government earns Rs.1,400 crore

NEW DELHI: The government has earned Rs 1,400 crore as revenue from the highly successful e-Visa scheme, offered to citizens of 163 countries visiting India as tourists, since its launch in 2014. Union Home Ministry officials said the popular e-Visa scheme was availed by 19 lakh tourists in 2017 and it is expected that more than 25 lakh tourists will avail the facility in 2018. Since its launch in 2014, the e-Visa scheme has earned revenue of more than Rs 1,400 crore.

India ranks 145th among 195 countries in healthcare access, quality: Lancet Study

NEW DELHI: India ranks 145th among 195 countries in terms of quality and accessibility of healthcare, behind its neighbours like China, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Bhutan, according to a Lancet study. The Global Burden of Disease study, however, mentioned that India has seen improvements in healthcare access and quality since 1990. In 2016, India's healthcare access and quality scored at 41.2 (up from 24.7 in 1990). "Although India's improvements on the (healthcare access and quality) HAQ index hastened from 2000 to 2016, the gap between the country's highest and lowest scores widened (23·4-point difference in 1990, and 30·8-point difference in 2016)," the study stated.

Election Commission to launch App to help voters to share malpractice proof

The Election Commission will launch a multi-lingual mobile application empowering people across the country to share evidence of malpractice by political parties, their candidates and activists ahead of the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, directly with the electoral body. Tried in Karnataka Chief Election Commissioner O.P. Rawat told The Hindu on Tuesday that such an application, called Model Code of Conduct Violation Reporting App, was made available for the first time in Bengaluru in the run-up to the recently concluded Karnataka Assembly polls.

Government launches Samagra Shiksha scheme to improve quality of school education

Human Resource Development Minister Prakash Javadekar on Thursday launched Samagra Shiksha scheme for school education. The scheme focuses on improving quality of education, enhancing the Learning outcomes and using technology to empower children and teachers. The Minister said, an annual grant of five thousand to 20 thousand rupees will be provided for strengthening libraries in schools. The scheme will be focus on digital education.

UNICEF launches data visualisation app on education scenario in India

NEW DELHI, MAY 24, The UNICEF today launched a 'data visualisation app' which provides a user-friendly visual representation of complex analytics of the education scenario in the country. The app has been made with technical inputs from the UNICEF, in collaboration with the National Institute of Education Planning and Administration (NIEPA) and the National Council for Educational Research and Training (NCERT).

NIC sets up cloud-enabled National Data Centre in Bhubaneswar

Pakistan named among top 3 sources for money laundering in UK

LONDON: Pakistan has been identified among three main source countries for money laundering in the UK, according to an analysis by the National Crime Agency (NCA). The agency found that Britain was the prime destination for corrupt "politically exposed persons" (PEPs) to invest their funds and the most common source countries of those funds were Russia, Nigeria and Pakistan. "The UK is a prime destination for foreign corrupt PEPs.

Nepal becomes first country in south-east Asia to eliminate Trachoma: WHO

Nepal has become the first country in south-east Asia to eliminate trachoma, world's leading cause of preventable blindness of infectious origin, the World Health Organisation (WHO) said in a statement today. Nepal's achievement is commendable and results from a strong political commitment, intense community engagement and impressive leadership demonstrated by civil society," said Poonam Khetrapal Singh, Regional Director of WHO South-East Asia Region.

Pakistan hosted SCO Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure meeting in Islamabad

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan is hosting a three-day Shanghai Cooperation Organisation-Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure (SCO-RATS) meeting in Islamabad from today – its first ever since the country became a member of SCO in June last year. Legal experts from the eight member states, including India, China, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and Pakistan, as well as representatives of the SCO and RATS Executive Committee are participating in the meeting.

Germany to host first edition of Global Wind Summit

HAMBURG (GERMANY), MAY 26, The first edition of the Global Wind Summit will be held here from September 25-28, 2018. The organisers of the four-day event are expecting speakers from about 100 countries, including India, China, the US, Spain and Denmark. "A number of Indian companies would be participating in the global event. We are also in touch with the Indian government," Anja Holinsky, project director, WindEnergy Hamburg, Hamburg Messe and Congress GmbH, told PTI here.

Colombia joins NATO as global partner

One year after reaching partnership deal through a peace agreement with South America, Colombia on Friday (local time) has formally joined the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. As reported by the Deutsche Welle, Colombian President Juan Manuel Santos announced the formalising of its global partner status. "We will formalize in Brussels next week - and this is very important - Colombia's entry into NATO in the category of the global partner. We will be the only country in Latin America with this privilege," Santos said in a televised address.

Operation Insaniyat: India sends second relief consignment to Bangladesh for displaced Rohingyas

Dhaka: India has sent to Bangladesh its second relief consignment to help tens of thousands of displaced Rohingya Muslims who fled Myanmar following a military crackdown, triggering one of the world's worst refugee crises. Over 6,00,000 Rohingya have fled Myanmar's violence-hit Rakhine State to neighbouring Bangladesh since August when the military intensified crackdown against alleged militant outfits in the area.

Gender bias caused excess deaths of girls under 5: Study

Washington: Gender discrimination results in "excess" deaths of girls under the age of five per year in India, according to a recent study. The study conducted by the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis found that there was an average of 239,000 excess deaths per year of girls under the age of five in India or 2.4 million in a decade, and excess female child mortality was found in 90 percent of districts in the country.

Akademik Lomonosov: Russia unveils world's first floating nuclear power plant

MURMANSK: Russia on Saturday unveiled the world's first floating nuclear power station at a ceremony in the port of the far northern city of Murmansk, where it will be loaded with nuclear fuel before heading to eastern Siberia. Built in Saint Petersburg, the Akademik Lomonosov arrived in Murmansk on Thursday, where it was moored in the port and presented to the media on Saturday.

Quegiao satellite: China launches relay satellite to explore dark side of Moon

China has successfully launched a relay satellite today to enable a rover to communicate with Earth from the Moon's mysterious far side, as part of the Communist giant's ambitious goal of being the first country to send such a probe. Named Queqiao (Magpie Bridge), the 400-kg satellite has a designed life of three years. It was carried by a Long March-4C rocket that blasted off at 5.28 am (local time) from southwest China's Xichang Satellite Launch Center, the China National Space Administration (CNSA) said.

GRACE-FO satellites: SpaceX launches NASA satellites to track Earth's water Cycle

A twin spacecraft to track the global water cycle has been successfully launched aboard the a SpaceX rocket, along with five communications satellites today, NASA said. The Gravity Recovery and Climate Experiment Follow-On (GRACE-FO) is a joint mission by NASA and the German Research Centre for Geosciences (GFZ). It lifted off on a SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket from the Vandenberg Air Force Base in California, US, sharing their ride into space with five Iridium NEXT communications satellites.

India's freshwater stocks in danger: NASA

India is among the hotspots where overuse of water resources has caused a sharp decline in the availability of freshwater, according to a first-of-its-kind study using an array of NASA satellite observations of the earth. Scientists led by NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center in the U.S. used data on human activities to map locations where the availability of freshwater is rapidly changing. The study, published in the journal Nature.
