
How the BJP is enabling ethnic cleansing in Manipur

Nearly two hundred people-the vast majority belonging to the Kuki community—have died since the violence in Manipur began on 3 May. Everyone is calling for the madness to stop, but there was a method to the madness. In fact, the carnage in Manipur can justifiably be referred to as ethnic cleansing, with the Biren Singh government and the Meitei mobs it enables using most of the coercive practices listed by a United Nations committee that defined the phrase. The result is a state caught in a humanitarian crisis of its government's making, with the demonisation of a community being followed by wanton violence against it, leaving it facing an uncertain future. The Narendra Modi government has stood by and let it play out, with the prime minister refusing to even appeal for an end to the violence. The upcoming parliamentary debate over a vote of no confidence may finally force him to break his silence. But the people of Manipur need more than words.


