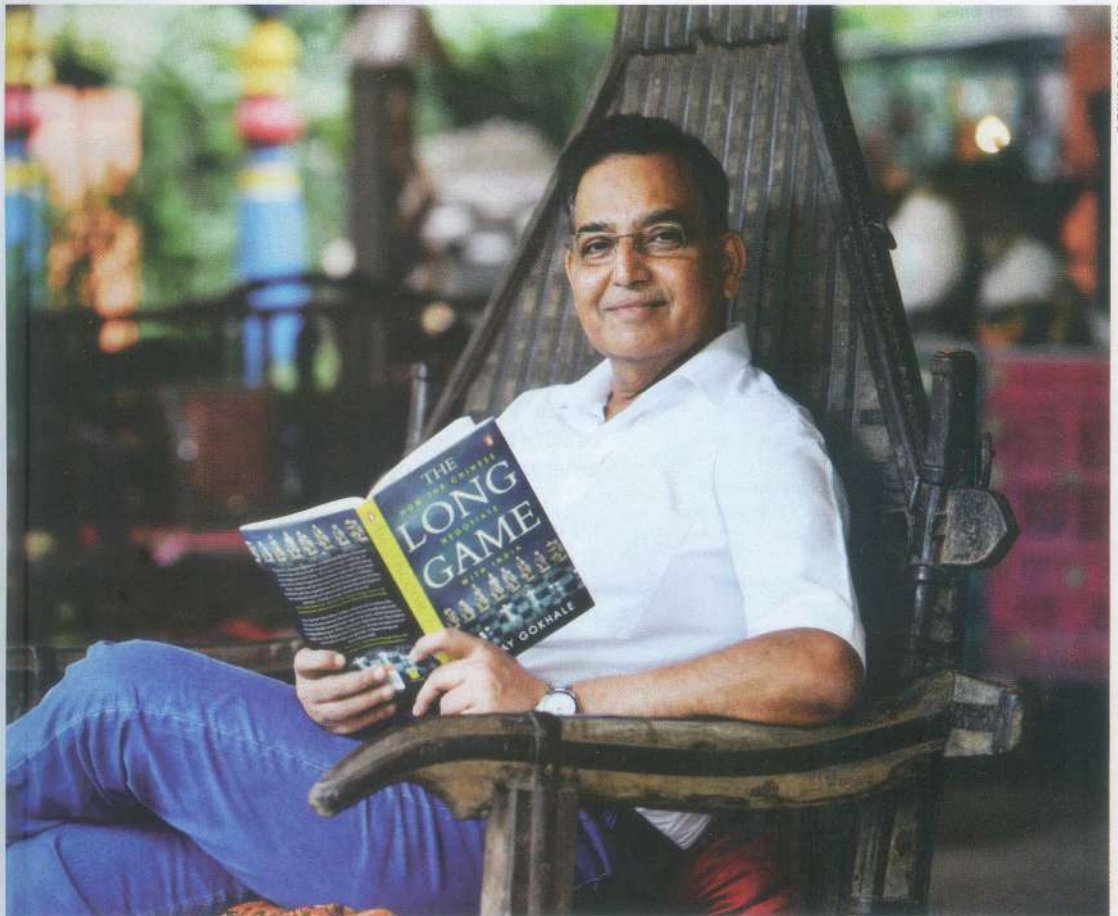


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Emcure, with a global footprint, is currently developing India's first mRNA vaccine for the novel corona virus. It is also planning to enter the capital market to reduce debt
