- ▶ Company secretary, as part of his duty and responsibility is only required to authenticate contents indicated in balance sheet or in offer document and is not required to go into veracity of buy back offer document and its legal compliances before authenticating such document and, therefore, company secretary could not be held guilty of making false or misleading open offer which had been approved by board of directors of company (SAT - Mumbai) **438**
- ▶ Interim moratorium under section 96 of IBC in respect of Guarantors wouldn't *ipso facto* apply against other co-guarantor(s) (Delhi) **402**
- ▶ Jurisdiction to proceed under section 8(4) of PMLA would come into play immediately upon passing of order of attachment by Adjudicating Authority, as order of confirmation of attachment passed by Adjudicating Authority is just like a decree of a civil court, which becomes executable moment it is drawn (Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh) **494**
- ▶ Section 10A of IBC is capable of suspending initiation of CIRP only against corporate debtor for a period between 25-3-2020 to 24-3-2021 and if legislature intended to suspend initiation of CIRP against personal guarantor as well, a similar amendment to IBC was required (NCLAT - New Delhi) **471**
- ▶ Where respondent-financial creditor extended a term loan facility to principle borrower and corporate debtor as guarantor itself mortgaged immovable property towards security of loan, corporate debtor being guarantor could not escape from its liability from repayment of loan sanctioned to principle borrower on ground that letter of guarantee was insufficiently stamped and that principle borrower had further granted loan to third party (NCLAT - New Delhi) **514**
- ▶ Exact amount of financial debt is immaterial as long as amount admitted by corporate debtor was more than minimum amount stipulated under section 4 of IBC i.e. Rs. 1 lakh at relevant time of filing of section 7 application (NCLAT - New Delhi) **422**

- ▶ Where a stockbroker operates from several stock exchanges in country, he has to obtain a certificate of registration from SEBI for each of stock exchange where he operates and also has to pay *ad valorem* fee prescribed in terms of Part III annexed to Regulation 10 of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Stockbrokers and Sub-Brokers) Regulations, 1992 in reference to each certificate of registration (SC) 282
- ▶ Under Prevention of Money-Laundering Act, 2002, money-laundering is an independent offence and therefore, order restraining coercive action being taken against petitioner by CBI, did not operate to prevent ED from carrying on with their investigation into allegations under 2002 Act (SC) 305
- ▶ Provisions of section 141 of Negotiable Instruments Act impose vicarious liability by deeming fiction, which presupposes and requires commission of offence by company or firm and, therefore, unless company or firm has committed offence as a principal accused, persons mentioned in sub-section (1) or (2) of section 141 would not be liable and convicted on basis of principles of vicariously liable (SC) 308
- ▶ NCLAT erred in concluding that there was no pre-existing dispute between corporate debtor and operational creditor over quality of coal supplied merely on ground of non-raising of debit note by corporate debtor as quality of coal could be established only after use/consumption and not on mere physical examination (SC) 325
- ▶ Where borrower obtained credit facility from bank and upon its failure to repay amount offered by bank under OTS scheme sought extension of time to make payment, in view of fact that granting extension of time would tantamount to rewriting contract, which is not permissible while exercising powers under article 226 of Constitution, impugned order passed by High Court granting extension to borrower to make payment was unsustainable and was to be quashed (SC) 366
- ▶ SC declines to allow power buyer to terminate Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with corporate debtor against whom CIRP had been initiated as corporate debtor had not suspended power supply and was willing and able to supply power (SC) 389

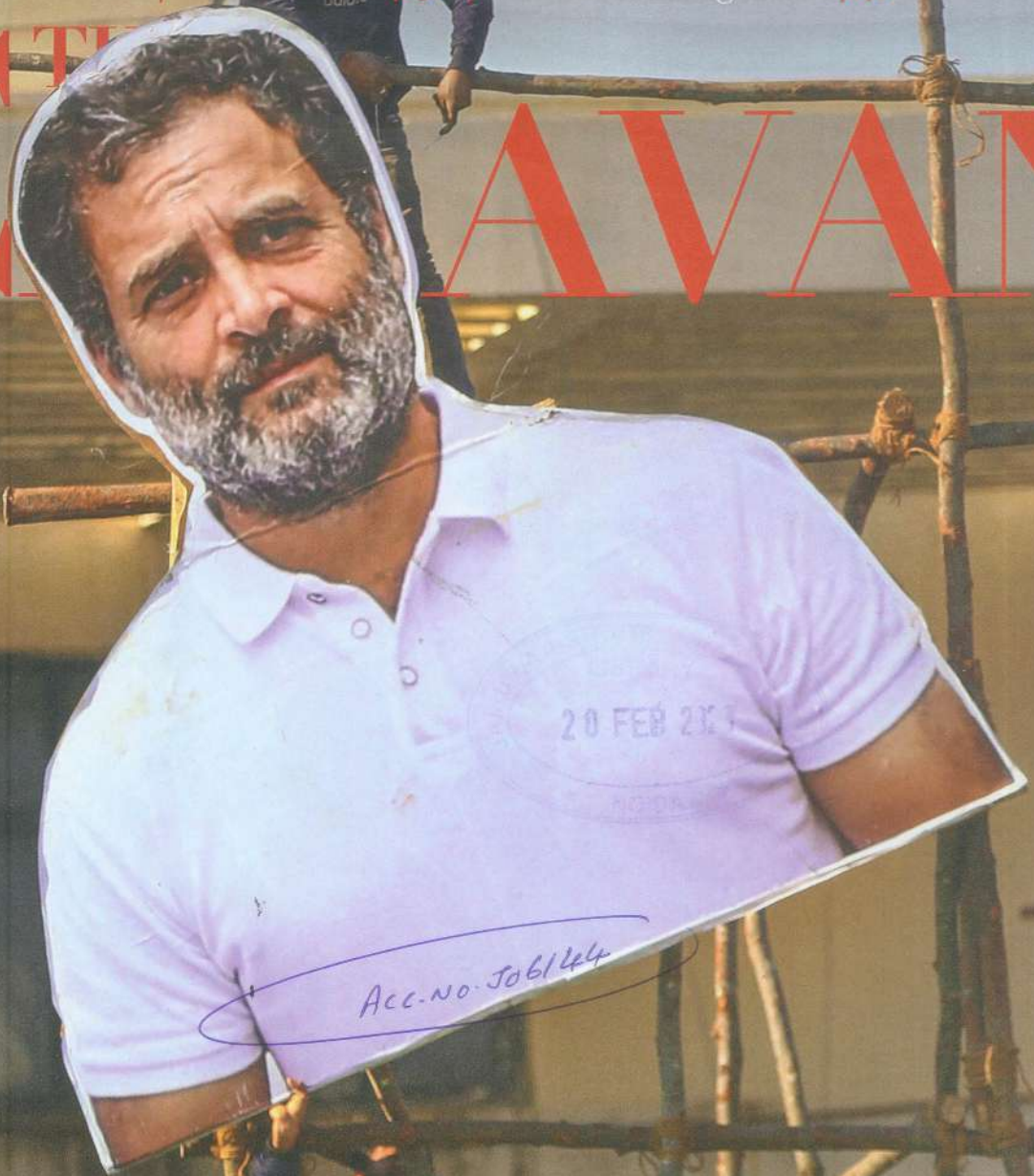

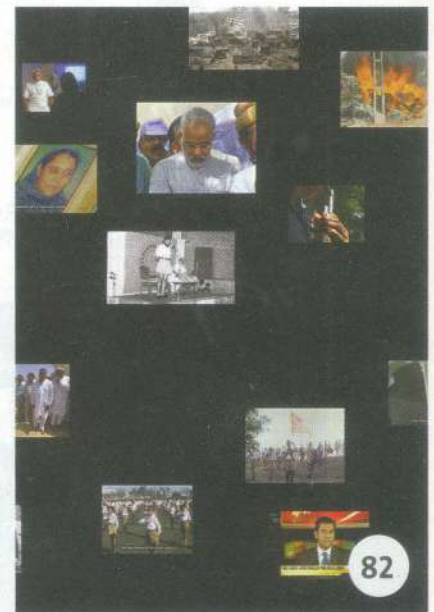
On 30 January, the former Congress president Rahul Gandhi completed his Bharat Jodo Yatra—which translates to “the journey to unite India”—a march of nearly thirty-five hundred kilometres from Kanyakumari to Srinagar meant to resist the hatred and violence spread by the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party. The yatra might work as a gesture, but to see it as an ideological alternative is a stretch. Instead, he tries to have it both ways, claiming to lead the resistance against orthodox Hinduism without alienating orthodox Hindus. Gandhi's double standards and contradictory politics, as well as the Congress's historical role in enabling the hatred and violence he claims to want to eradicate, reduce an avowed exercise in nation-building to a project meant to rehabilitate a single politician's image.
