"Oh, our lawyers recommend that I not give investment advice."

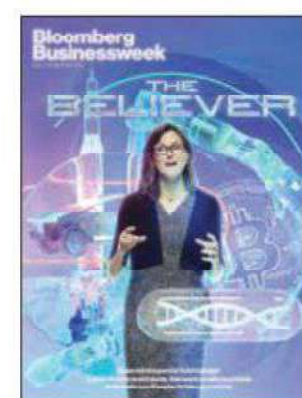
